#### 1. Project Summary

The International Institute for Rights and Development - Geneva (IRD-Geneva) is an International NGO, established in January 2011 in Geneva, with the aim to enhance and support both human rights and development by adopting new strategies and policies for real changes.

To these ends, the IRD-Geneva as a neutral and impartial organization concentrates on:

- enhancing cooperation and partnership between the private and public sector in the academic, technical and political spheres;
- providing technical and humanitarian assistance in developing countries;

IRD-Geneva is organizing a training course on the UN Mechanism of Human Rights and the UPR in Arabic. The main objective of this training is to strengthen the capacity of human rights organizations by training their representatives to the effective use of the system of treaty bodies of the United Nations (UN) and the Universal Periodic Review (UPR).

The course is intended for human rights defenders and organizations to develop their ability to use the international system of human rights, particularly treaty bodies and UPR mechanism of the Council of Human Rights in their job.

The course also includes sessions on advocacy and lobbying techniques. The course focuses on how human rights defenders can use the treaty bodies and the UPR at the national level to promote the implementation of the recommendations.

#### 2. Organizational Background and Capacity to implement the project

IRD-Geneva counts several successes in capacity building through trainings organized in different developing countries (Palestine, Jordan, Morocco). In light of its extensive field experience, the IRD-Geneva assessed needs in increasing project management skills in a more standardized perspective for professionals of the humanitarian sector.

#### 3. Project Objectives and Expected Results

At the end of the course, participants will have acquired knowledge and skills related to:

- The roles and functions of the Universal Periodic Review (UPR), the role of the Working Group, the UPR process including reporting
- The roles and functions of the supervisory bodies of Treaties;
- Communication skills

- The process for submitting reports, national consultations and opportunities for interaction between NGOs and National Human Rights Institutions (NHRIs) with OST and the UPR;
- Special procedures for certain treaty bodies, including individual complaints and urgent action procedures;
- Advocacy for effective implementation of the recommendations of the treaty bodies and the UPR at the national level and the subsequent follow-up;
- The role and function of the Human Rights Council and the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights;

After a complete success in the course, participants will receive a certificate.

#### 4. Description of Project Activities

The training course will have a duration of five days in January or March, and will be held in Geneva- Switzerland. The course will include practical training through guided visits and tours to the United Nations premises and attend sessions. The training will explain the different UN instruments including:

The International system of human rights (institutions)	To have an overview of the international system of human rights, To understand the place of treaty
Miscellaneous	bodies and the Council of Human Rights / EPU in this system
	To understand the opportunities for involvement / intervention of civil society within the framework of the UN Charter and treaty monitoring bodies (OST)
	To ensure that participants gained an understanding of the entire system before starting on specific aspects of the treaty bodies and the Universal Periodic Review (UPR)

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General introduction on treaty bodies : roles and function	To become familiar with the structure, role and functioning of the treaty bodies, with the practical and concrete aspects of the work of NGOs in the context of treaty bodies  To evaluate the different working methods of treaty bodies individually  To learn the key concepts relating to the procedures of treaty bodies, such as the report of the State, concluding observations, general comments, individual communications, etc
The committee on civil and political rights : overview	To understand the obligations of States towards the Committee of Human Rights  To understand the Committee's mandate and how NGOs can collaborate and work with (information exchange, submission of communications, etc.)
Introduction to the Universal Periodic Review	To learn the different stages of the process, including the documentary base initial phases of the UPR and the adoption of the report of the Working Group  Assess the role and potential of the "other" organizations / people in the process, in terms of opportunities for involvement / action civil society before, during and after the UPR  To give an analysis of the effectiveness of the UPR to date
